In our Remembrance Day assembly on Monday we heard about Sidney Cornell who was a young soldier in the British Army. In 1944 he parachuted into Normandy on D-Day and through the danger, the darkness and numerous injuries he "carried on with his job cheerfully and efficiently." Sergeant Sidney Cornell was awarded the Distinguished Conduct Medal for bravery and was truly courageous. We took time to remember people like Sidney who did difficult and dangerous things to keep us safe. The children of St Minver School demonstrated respect throughout our assembly and during our one-minute silence. I am very proud of them.

Head's Assembly This week we continued to explore the value of commitment and discussed different ways that we can be prepared for a day of learning. We talked about things like:

- Eating a healthy breakfast
- Bringing to school the things that we need
- · Committing ourselves to reading daily
- Setting ourselves small daily goals

Older children have enjoyed working with the younger members of our school community to solve problems, we've had fun with magical maths and we have found out about potential careers that involve or require mathematical thinking – roller coaster designer being my favourite!
