### PTA Christmas donation dates

If your child is absent from school without authorisation, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £60 if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice may result in legal action. Absence not authorised by the school may result in a prosecution in the Magistrates' Court under Section 444(1) or Section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996, leading to a fine of up to £2,500 and/or a custodial sentence. Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court.

## Is my child well enough for school?

**Respiratory infections**—Children should not attend school if they have a high temperature and are unwell. If your child has **mild symptoms** such as runny nose, headache and cough who are otherwise well, **can continue to attend school**.

**Coughs and colds**—It's fine to send your child to school with a minor cough or common cold. But if they have a fever, keep them off school until the fever goes.

**Covid-19**—Children that have tested positive for COVID-19 should not attend school for 3 days after the day of the test. After three days, children can return to school, providing they feel well and do not have a temperature.

**Ear infection**—If your child has an ear infection **and** a high temperature, keep them off school until their temperature goes away.

**Diarrhoea and vomiting**—Children with vomiting or diarrhoea should stay away from school until they have not been sick or had diarrhoea for at least 2 days (48 hours).

**Chickenpox**—If your child has chickenpox, keep them off school until all the spots have crusted over. This is usually about 5 days after the spots first appeared. **We have children in school that are immunocompromised, this puts them at serious risk if exposed to measles, chicken pox or shingles, you should let the school office know immediately if you suspect your child has measles, chickenpox or shingles.**
