Lundy Class

Welcome to the new academic year 2024-2025 and Lundy Class. It has been lovely to welcome the children back after the long summer break and to see that they have all returned happy and ready to learn. We are pleased to report that the children are settling quickly into the routines of their new class structure and are enjoying the start of a new school year with their friends, new and old. Included in this letter is some useful information about the half term ahead and an outline of the subjects we intend to cover.

Topics and Themes

Our first topic of the term is The Stone Age and this will be followed, after half term by a topic on Mountains. Much of the learning across the different subjects we study will be linked to our topic areas. Our first English unit this term will be an in depth look at sentence structure and the building blocks that make a grammatically accurate sentence. This will underpin our creative writing later in the half term which will be closely linked to our topic on the stone age. Science will also be closely linked to our overall topic area. Our first unit is on animals including humans and this will be followed by a study of rocks and the forces that shape them. Linking our learning wherever possible to our topic in exciting practical ways: such as the study of prehistoric cave art and mark making in our art lessons. In maths this term, we will be working on the place value of numbers up to 1000. We will also be working on addition and subtraction later in the half term; learning how to use the formal written methods for addition and subtraction as well as the mental methods.

Class Routines

PE will be on a Tuesday, with Mr Gill and Friday afternoon with Mrs Hewitt. Please remember to send your child's PE kit in to school ready for these sessions. We will continue to do Wake and Shake every morning as well as doing our Active Mile on a Friday at 2:40pm. Homework will be set on a Friday and handed in the following Friday, where we will go through it together as a whole class. This will generally include a piece of maths, spellings, reading or grammar work, which should take no more than 10 minutes for each.

Our Expectations

Children throughout the school are encouraged at all times to be polite, diligent and hard working. We want the children to do the best they can and feel a sense of pride and

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achievement in everything they do. We welcome mistakes and encourage the children to persevere and be resilient. We encourage independence and organisational skills and urge parents to support this by teaching them how to prepare their own school bags with what they need, so that they know what is in them. We would also expect them to come in to school, with increasing independence e.g. carry their own coats and bags and put them on their cloakroom pegs. Alongside this we promote the value of teamwork and a respect for all other members of 'Team St Minver'.

Class rewards

House points are given to individuals as reward for effort, excellent behaviour, attitudes and work. Children will also continue to have their own personal 'Star Chart' reward card, where they can work towards a small treat or an agreed whole class fun activity, once it has been completed.
