



It was also fantastic to see so many of you at the fireworks display arranged by our wonderful PTA last night. We're privileged to be immersed in such bright community spirit; all raising money to support our brilliant school. Thank you to everyone who was involved in the organising and delivery and to those of you who supported the event. The amount raised has blown us away: £2241.50! Just wow!

Head's Assembly I meet with the children every Tuesday morning and this half term we are continuing to delve into the 'Be Brave' part of our school motto. Being committed to our learning takes bravery and courage and over the course of the next few weeks we will be looking at what it means to be committed to our learning and how we can demonstrate this commitment.



One the of the interesting ideas that we will be exploring together is The Cognitive Load Theory. The teachers and the children are going to be finding ways to reduce cognitive load so that they can commit more useful information to our memories (in other words, how we can learn more). This week I shared the Willingham's Simple Memory Model with the children, and we discussed how our environment can play a part in overloading our brain. Which leads me to our **weekly challenge** ...



Our challenge this week involves keeping our classrooms tidy with space for the things we really need to support our learning. Of course, children who require additional tools and resources will keep these things close by, but the challenge is to take note of what's around you and decide what you really need and what is taking up valuable space on our desks and in our brains.
